TEACHING

Classes taught at MTSU

Classes taught every semester:

VCOM 2950 - Visual Communication Applications. Introduces industry-standard graphics applications used for print, Web, and digital publication; discusses typography, design, and color theory; overview of publication procedures. Combined lecture/lab.

VCOM 3920 - Information Web Design. Introduces software, design principles, and technology used for communicating concepts, information, and narratives through websites and digital media. Overview of social, political, copyright, and ethical issues involving websites, digital, and social media. Combined lecture/lab.

Classes taught every other semester:

VCOM 3950 - Digital Storytelling for Journalism. Advanced practice in communicating concepts, information, and narratives through the use of websites and digital media. Topics include contemporary practices and use of code and software for online and digital media production, combined with in-depth discussion of social, political, copyright, and ethical issues pertaining to websites and digital and social media. Combined lecture/lab.

VCOM 4010 - Information Design. Application of advanced design principles and production methods in the creation and distribution of print and digital publications. Students work cooperatively on several projects over the course of a semester. Combined lecture/lab.

VCOM 4180 - Senior Portfolio. Capstone class in the VCOM concentration. Students revise and create print and digital designs for the purpose of professional portfolio presentation. Professional topics are discussed, including creative strategies, legal and copyright issues and client relations.

Taught every semester 2008-2013 (formerly GRAF 3910 Basic Media Design):

VCOM 3930 - Visual Storytelling for Journalism. Design process and production methods for communicating concepts, information, and narratives through the use of visual elements in print, Web, and digital media. Develops skill sets of typographic language and design, photography selection and use, illustration techniques and intermediate layout design for the purpose of visual storytelling in the form of such projects as editorial layout in digital and print formats, ad campaigns, and logo design. Combined lecture/lab.

Taught three times, in summer 2009, 2010 and 2012:

VCOM 2010 - Introduction to Visual Communication. Overview of concepts for effective visual communication; the role of visual elements and design practices in a cultural, historical, and political context; basic typography and design, electronic and digital composition and reproduction, and technological aspects of design and production.

Curriculum Development

VCOM concentration revision

2014-2016: I initiated discussion of curriculum proposals with other VCOM faculty to restructure the VCOM concentration courses and requirements, including adding the two Web design courses to the requirements, changing course titles and descriptions, and revising degree requirements. The revisions came into effect starting in 2017.

New course

VCOM 3920 Information Web Design. I had been teaching a special topics course, JOUR 4800 - News Web Design, since Fall 2010. In 2014 I proposed it as a new course and it was added as VCOM 3980 to the sequence beginning in Fall 2015, and renumbered to 3920 in 2017 along with the concentration revision.

New course

VCOM 3950 Digital Projects. I proposed this course as part of the concentration revision and it was approved along with those revisions. Its purpose is to serve as a second Web design and interactive graphics class following VCOM 3920. I first taught it in Fall 2017, when it became a graduation requirement to students following the revised upper division form.

Course development

VCOM 2950 Media Design Applications. This course had just been added at the time of my hire in 2008, making me and one other instructor the first to teach it. The other instructor left MTSU a couple years later. My curriculum and course materials established the foundation for the course, which is usually offered in 4-5 sections each semester.
