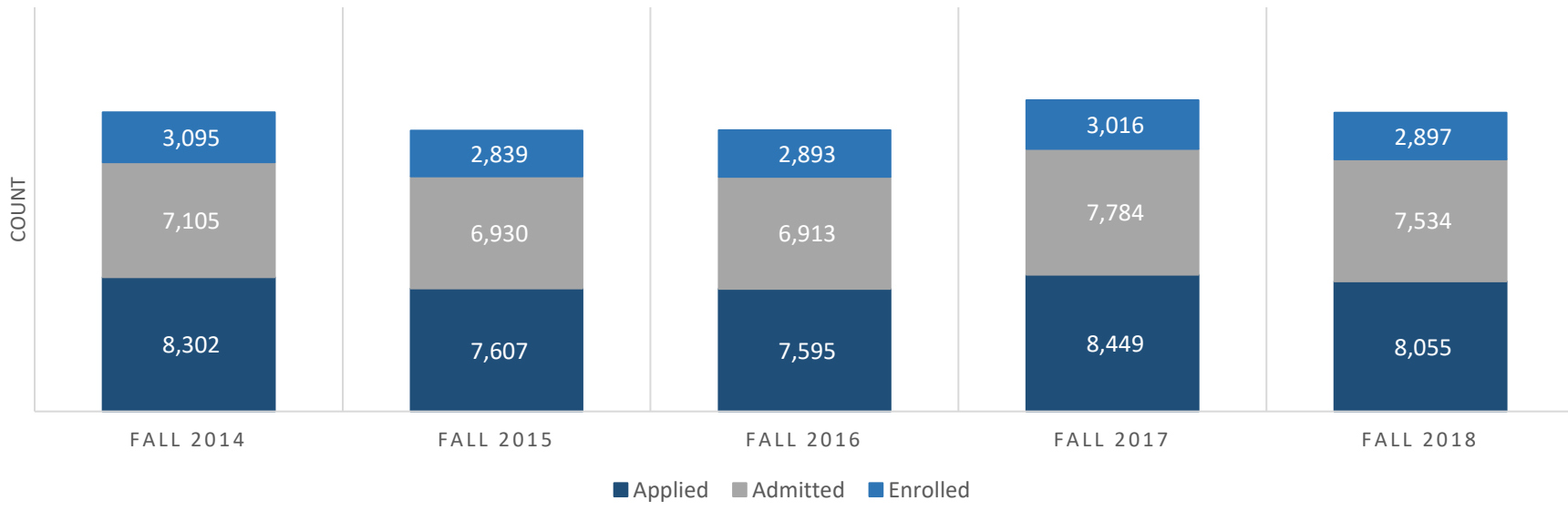

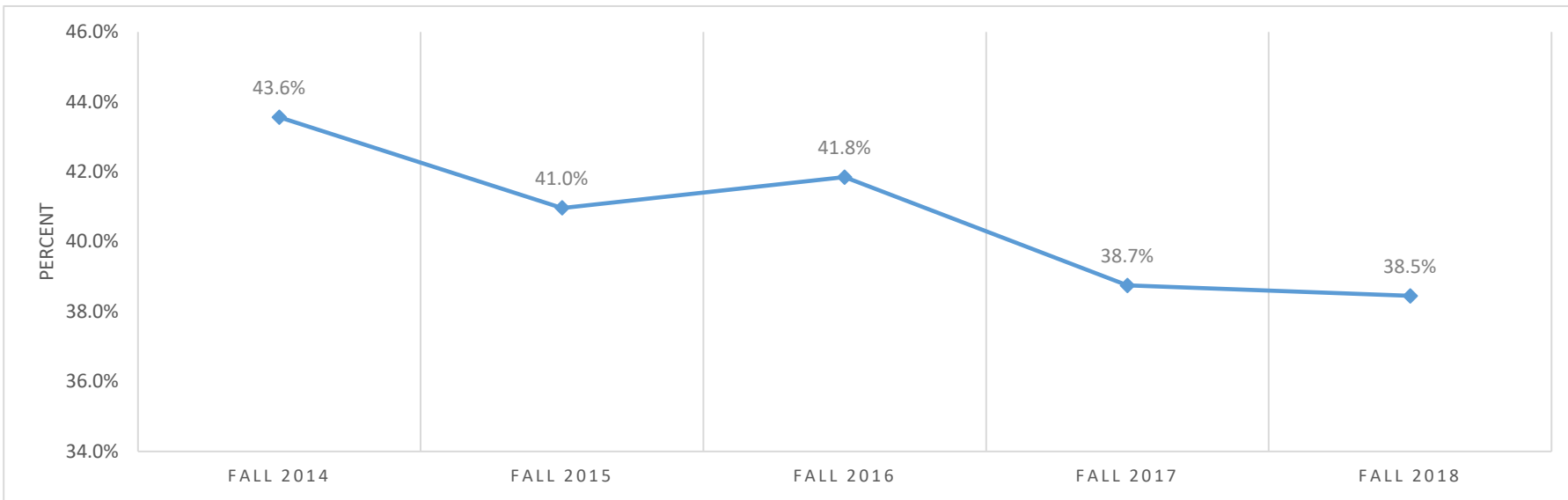

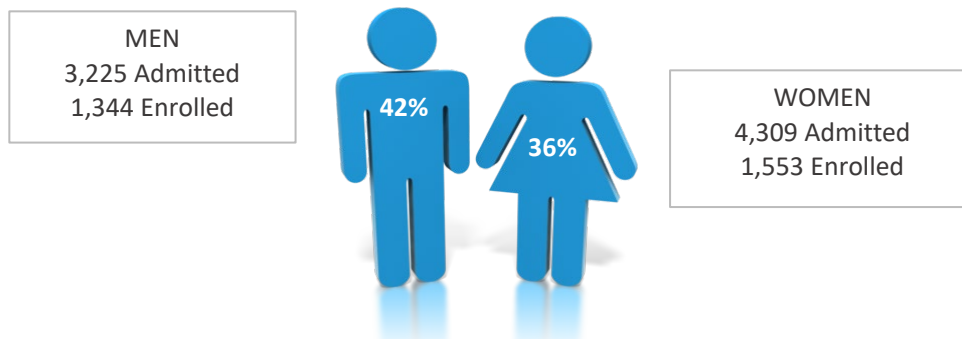
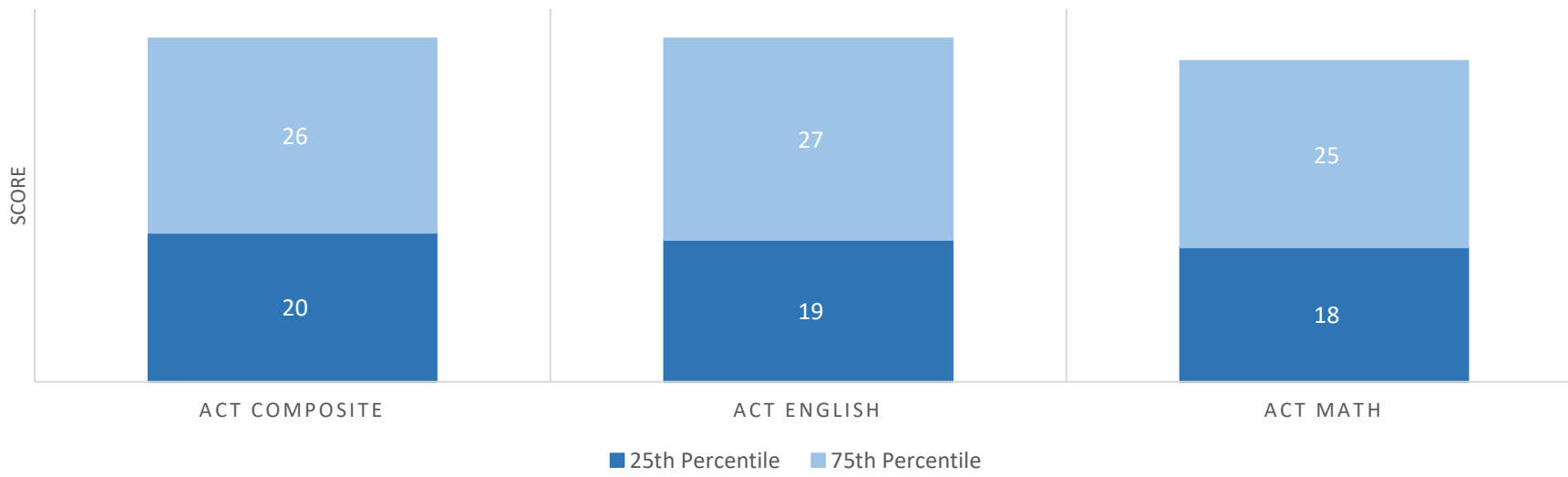
New Freshmen Applied, Admitted and Enrolled



Percent of Admitted New Freshmen Who Enrolled



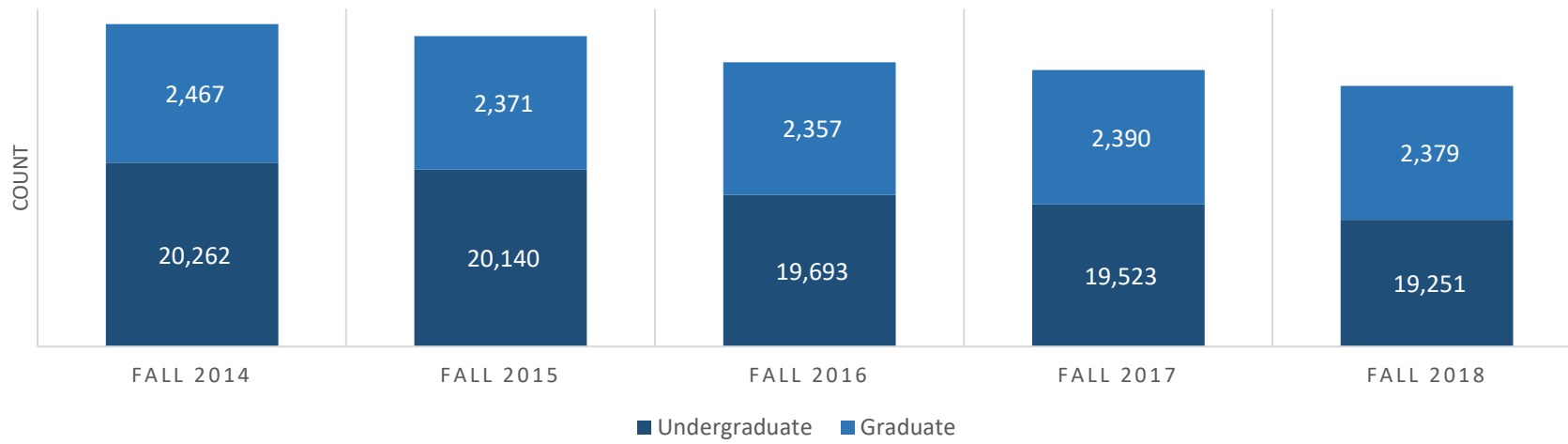
ACT Scores of New Freshmen Enrolled Fall 2018



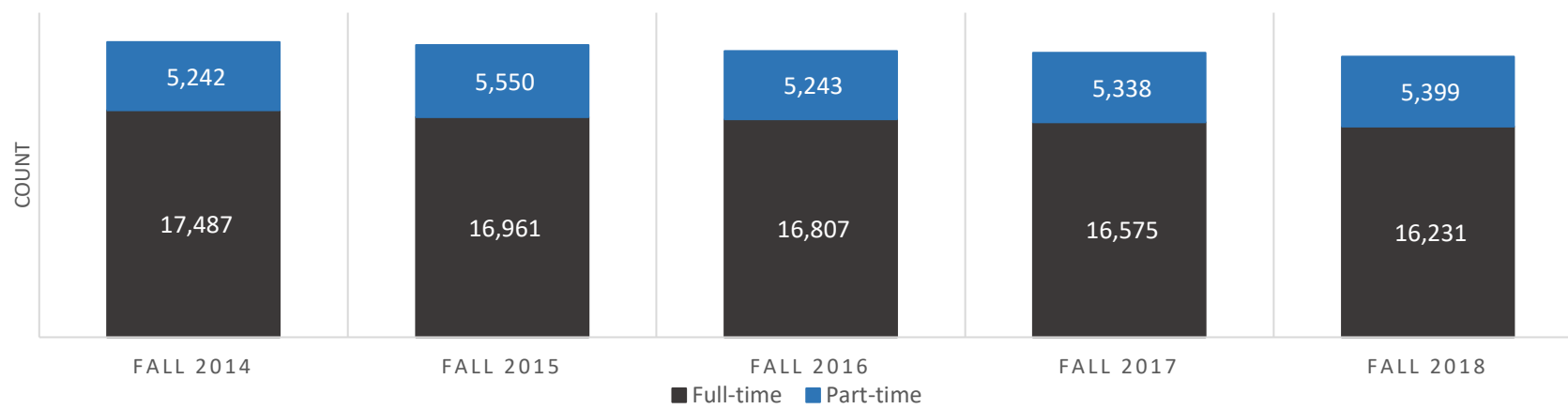
Fall 2018 Admitted and Enrolled by Gender

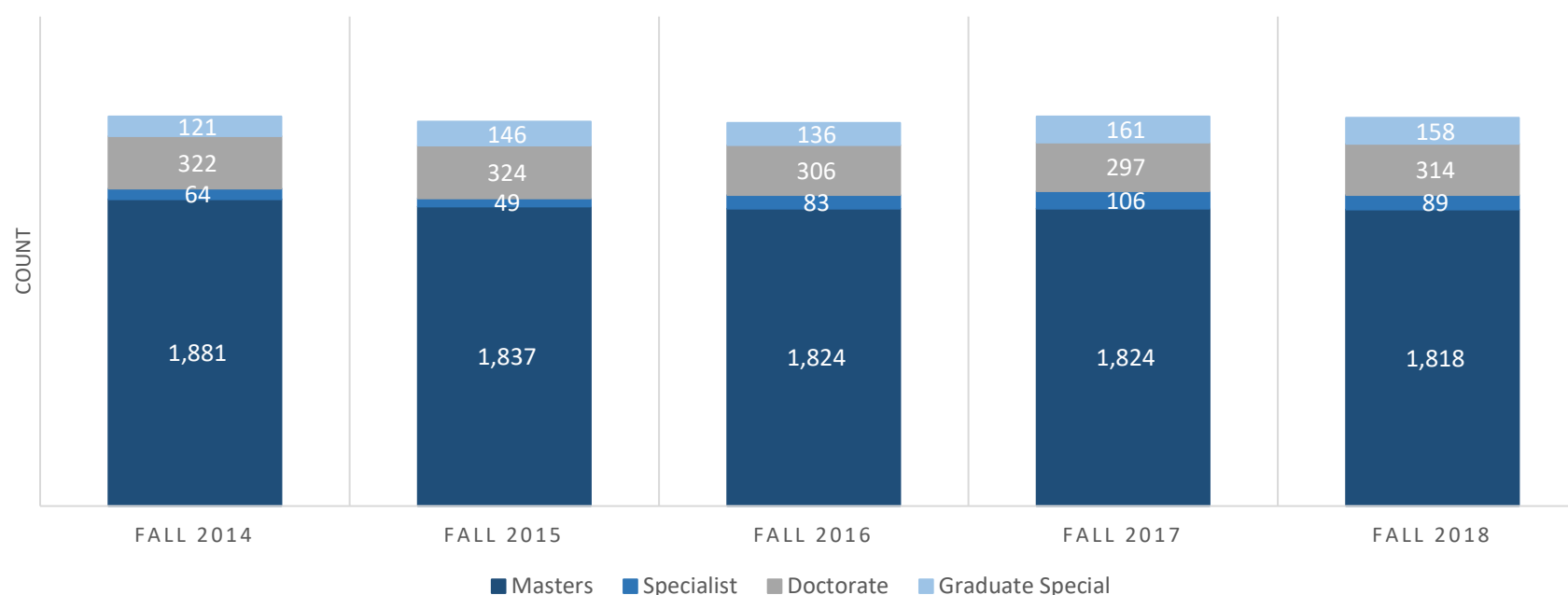

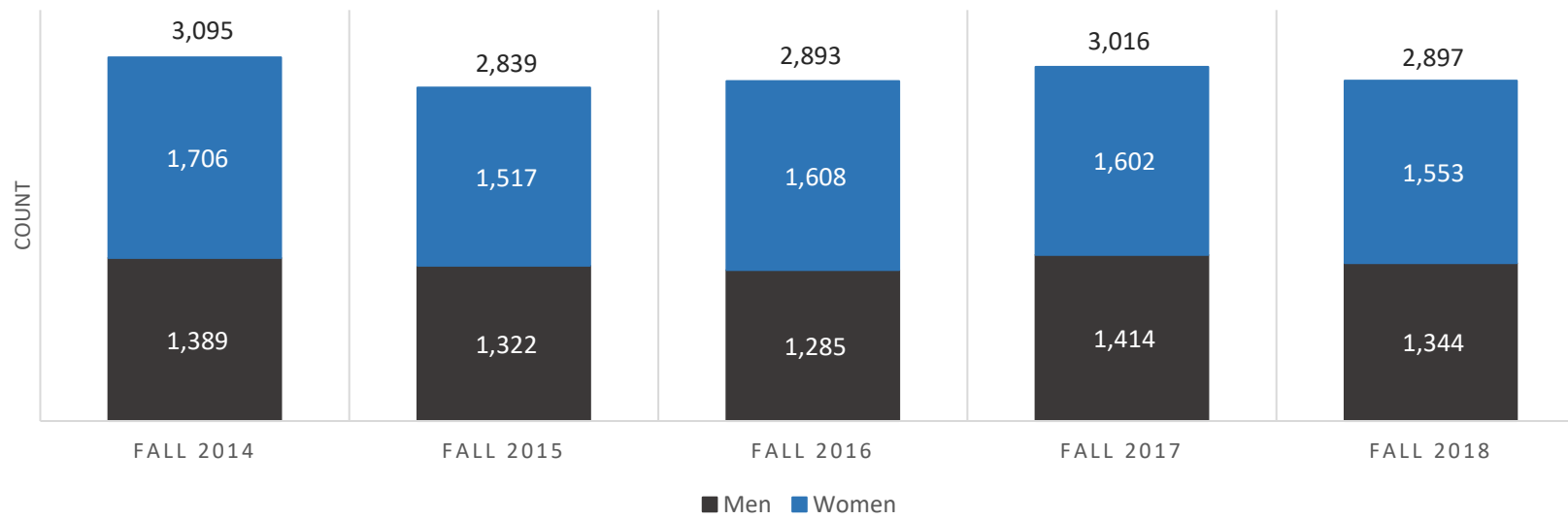

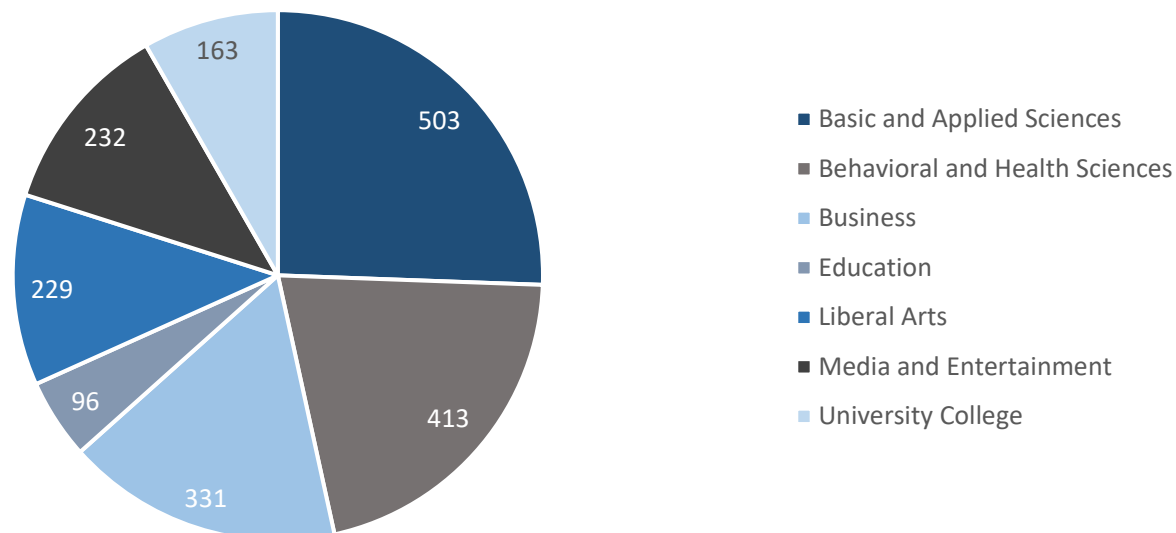

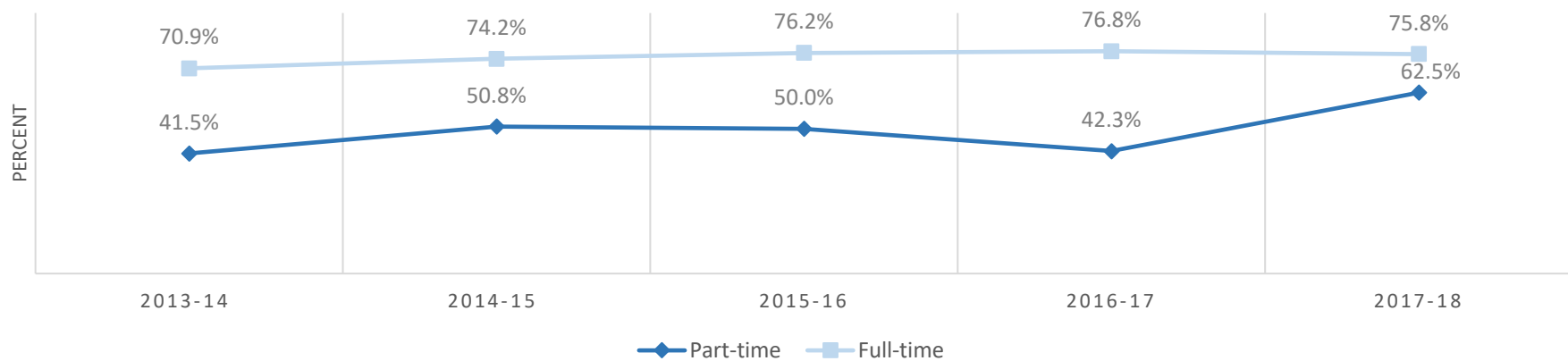

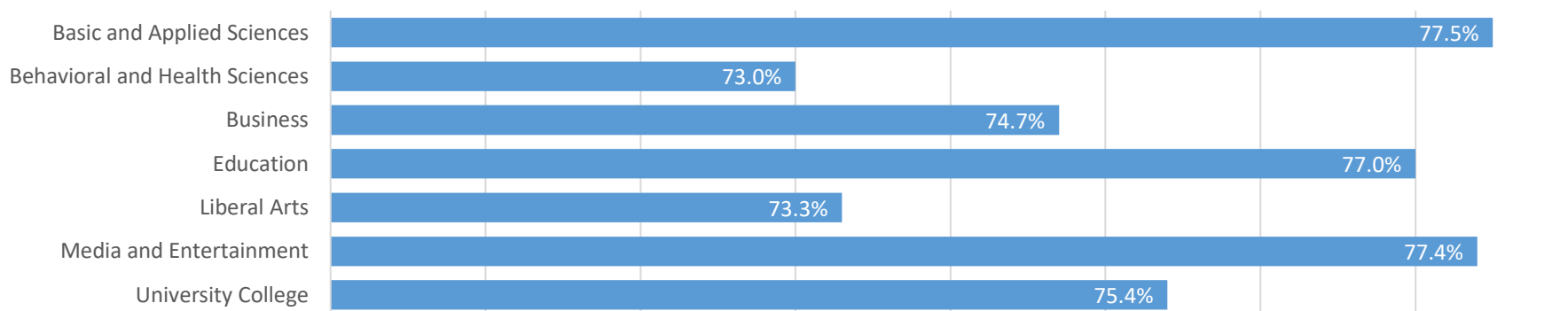

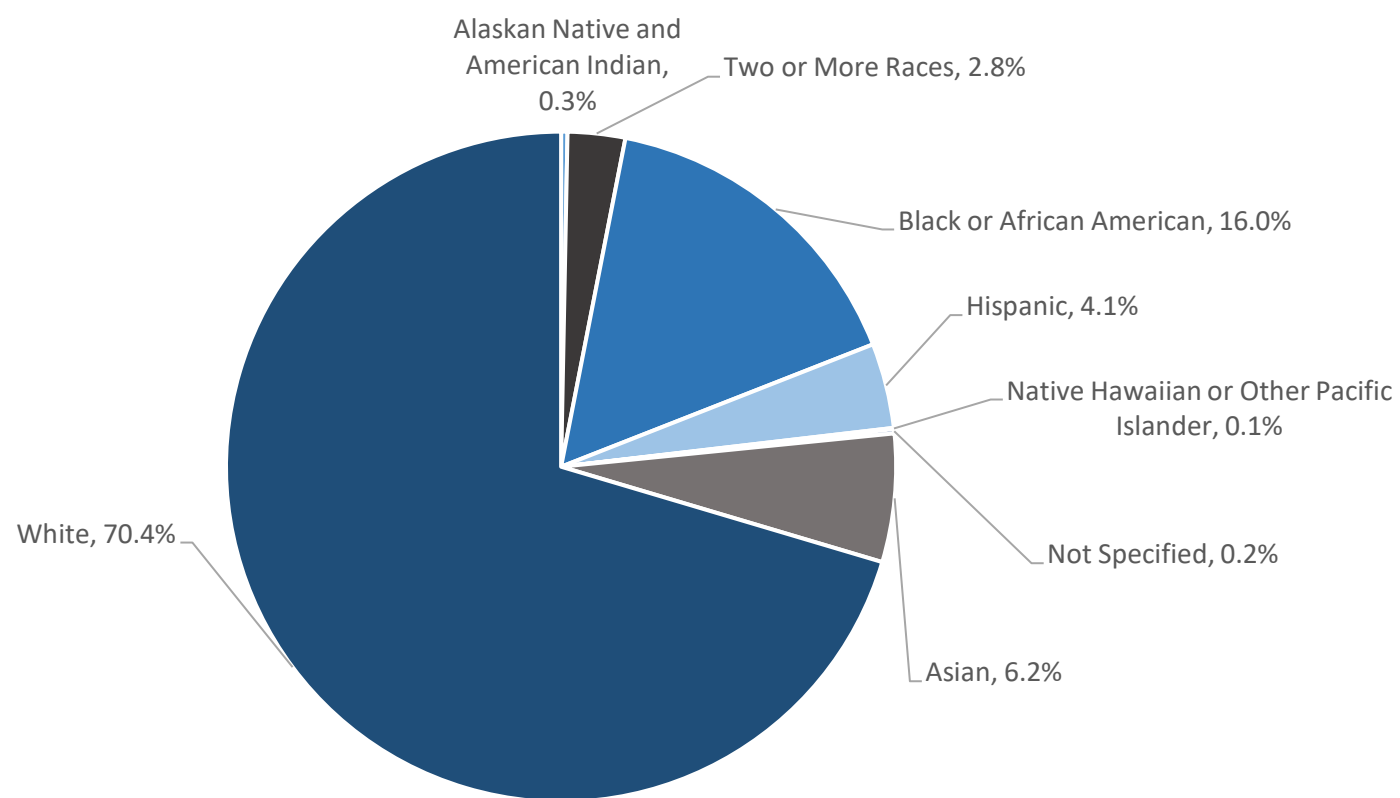

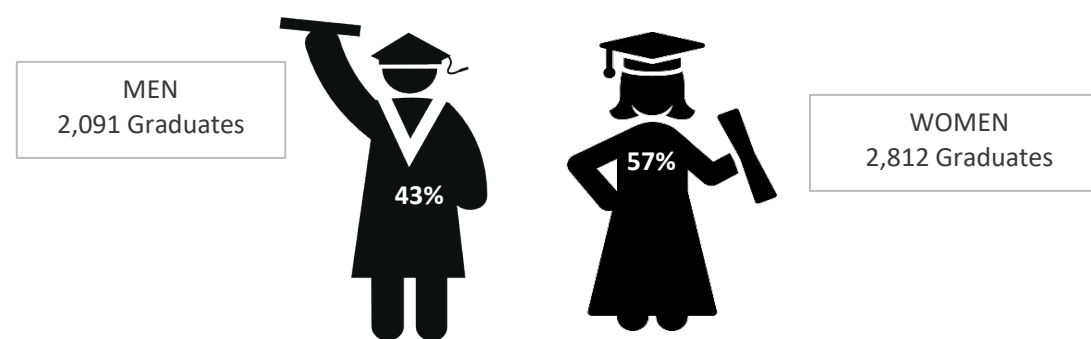

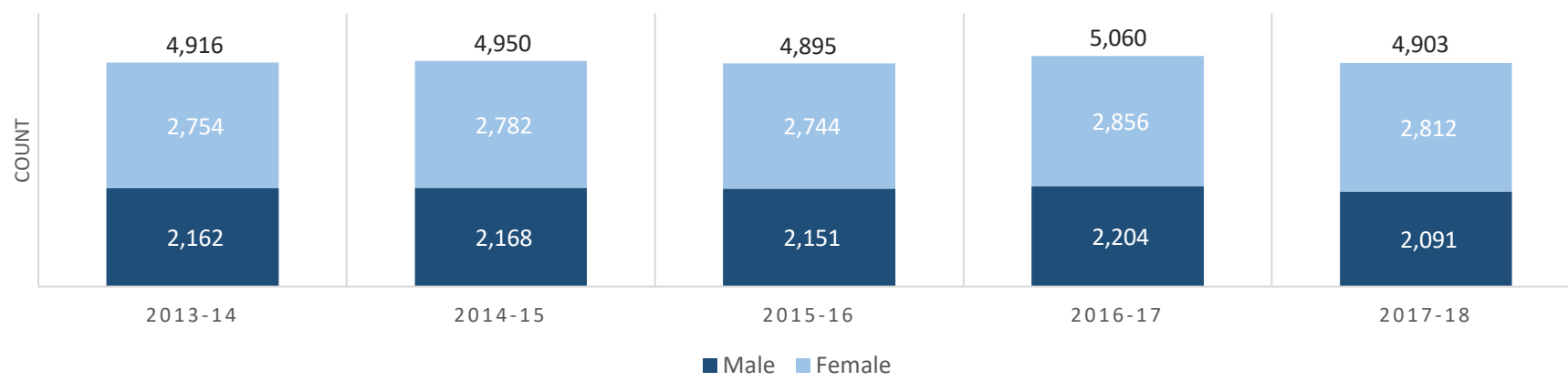

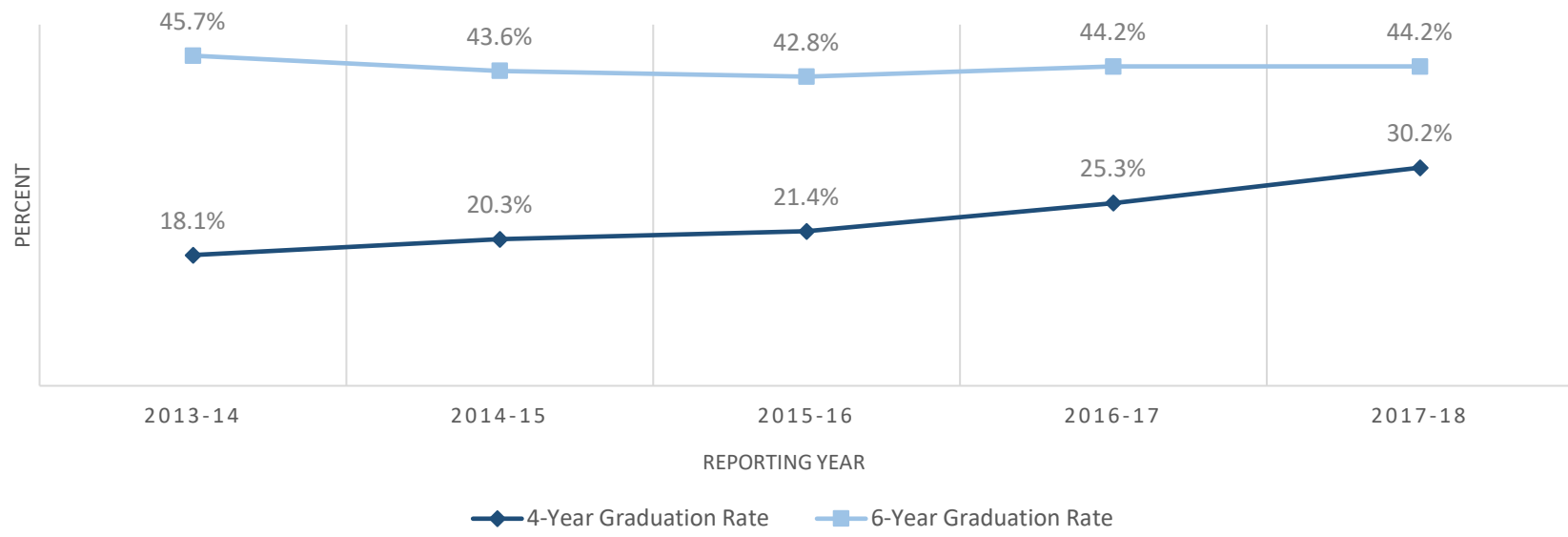

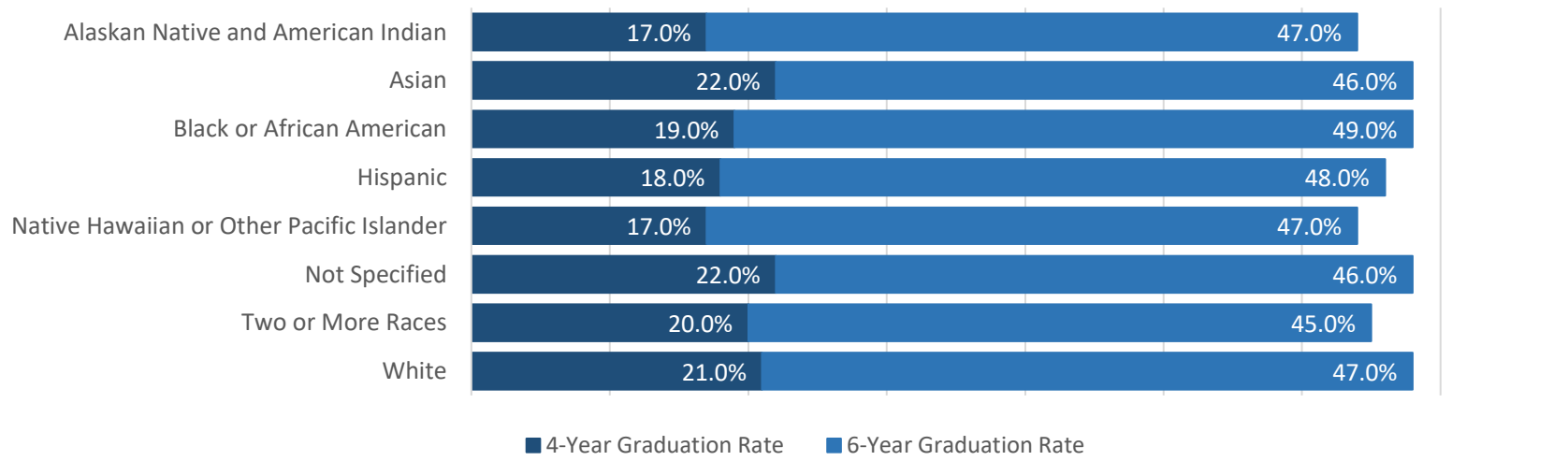

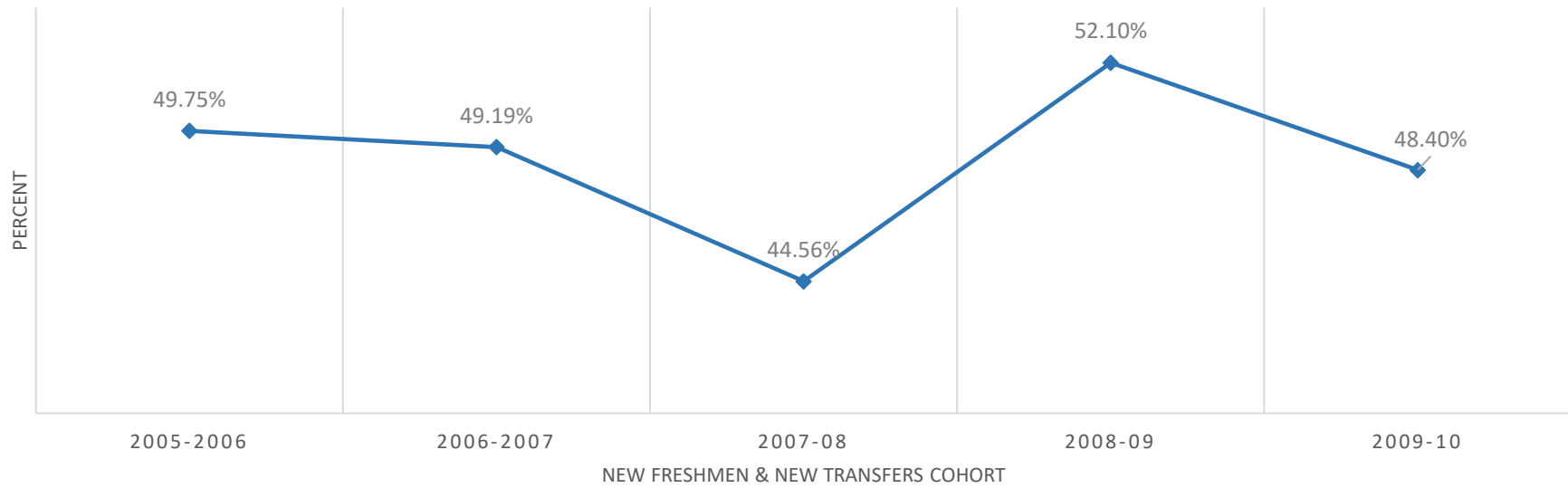
