SGA Bill 6-22-S

A Bill to Reduce the Hour Requirement for Executive Board Candidates

Whereas:

Article IV Section 1 C of the Student Government Association Constitution states that any candidate for an Executive Board office must be a full or part-time student.

Whereas: accredited institution, or be a graduate student at the time of candidacy. A student must have accumulated a minimum of forty-five (45) credit hours from any

Whereas: A minimum of 12 hours per semester is required to remain a full-time student.

Whereas: The sophomore threshold begins at 30 hours.

Whereas: students who have accumulated 45 hours in three semesters. This disqualifies those who take the minimum full-time enrollment of 12 hours every semester. The current credit hour requirement limits potential executive board candidates to only

Section 2: The Freshman Council President and Freshman Council Delegate do not qualify as potential candidates for the office of President or Vice President if they do not meet all requirements as outlined by Article IV Section 1 C of the Constitution, despite their status as members of senate.

Section 3: This bill shall take effect upon favorable passage by the Student Government Association Senate.
