### 4a. Scope: Work to be accomplished

The outdoor lamps across campus are in the process of being retrofitted for LEDs. At present, we replace about 180/year, as CosmoPolis metal halide bulbs—the current proprietary technology—is being phased out.

This project involves removing the current ( $\sim$ 55) metal halide bulbs and installing retrofitted LED lights in the lamps around Old Main Circle and Walnut Grove.

#### 4b. Scope: Benefit Statement

Approval of this project would bring to campus all of the advantages LED lights have over metal halide lights—efficiencies of energy, cost, and labor. Though LEDs cost more up front, they save in electrical costs over the course of their lifespan because, unlike metal halide bulbs, they produce very little heat, emit focused light, and require no warm-up time. Moreover, whereas metal halide bulbs last for about 2-3 years, LEDs can last for about 12 years, resulting in labor savings and reduced waste production.
